Four year cohort graduation rate as defined by 34 C.F.R. 200.19(b)(1)(i)-(iv) is the number of students who graduate in four years with a regular high school diploma divided by the number of students who form the adjusted cohort for the graduating class. From the beginning of 9<sup>th</sup> grade, students who are entering that grade for the first time form a cohort that is subsequently "adjusted" by adding any students who transfer into the cohort later during the 9<sup>th</sup> grade and the next three years and subtracting any students who transfer out, emigrate to another country, or die during the same period. **Office of Data Management and Analysis, April 18, 2012, South Carolina Department of Education**
